**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An act controlling certain synthetic opioids.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 31 of Chapter 94C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting in line 51, after the words “(42) Trimeperidine”
3 the following:- “(43) U-47700”.

4 Section 2. Subsection (c) of Section 32E of Chapter 94C of the General Laws, as
5 appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the words “opium or
6 any derivative thereof”, each time it appears the following:- “,U-47700 or any derivative
7 thereof”.
