The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)

An Act relative to radon testing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the
2 department of public health shall promulgate regulations to require that all child care programs,
3 as licensed or authorized by the department of early education and care, and public schools
4 undergo routine radon testing. Testing schedules, documentation of testing, standards for
5 acceptable radon levels and plans for mitigation of unacceptable levels of radon shall be
6 determined, and made public, by the department of public health within 1 year of the enactment
7 of this bill.
