### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act to reduce exposure to BPA.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
- 2 following section:-
- 3 Section 233. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following words shall have the
- 4 following meanings unless the context clearly requires otherwise:
- 5 "BPA", the chemical bisphenol A.
- 6 "Person", a natural person, individual, business, corporation, unincorporated association,
- 7 firm, partnership, joint venture or other organization, entity or group of individuals.
- 8 (b) No person shall use thermal paper containing BPA as a receipt of purchase for any9 sale.

- 10 (c) The commissioner of public health shall promulgate rules and regulations as the
  11 commissioner considers necessary to implement this section.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 1 shall take effect one year immediately subsequent to passage.
