An Act providing for a tax exemption on the sale of recycled materials.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 6 of chapter 64H of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

3           (yy) Sales of tangible personal property which by weight contain greater than 70%  
4 recycled material.

5           SECTION 2. Section 1 shall be effective until December 31, 2020 unless extended by  
6 the legislature and signed by the governor.
