## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to the creation of a training tax credit.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 6 of chapter 62 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
  after subsection (t) the following new subsection:-
- 3 (u) There shall be a credit for any employer based in Massachusetts who with their own
- 4 resources including but not limited to training at employer own facilities, payment for training at
- 5 a third party facility hires individuals for at least two weeks. The credit shall be \$500 for each
- 6 newly hired full time employee hired in the first three quarters of that fiscal year, not to exceed
- 7 \$25,000 per business in any calendar year.
- 8 SECTION 2. SECTION 1 shall expire on July 1, 2020.
