An Act designating January as peace officer history month.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 15BBBBBB,  
2 as appearing in chapter 267 of the acts of 2016, the following section:-

3 Section 15CCCCCC. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the  
4 month of January as Peace Officer History Month and recommend that the month be observed in  
5 an appropriate manner by the people.
