**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to executive employee compensation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 6A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting the following new section:-

3 Section 105. If an executive officer or employee of an executive office is to be
4 compensated at an annual rate higher than \$200,000, such compensation shall not be paid out of
5 the executive office’s operating budget. All such compensation shall be funded by a separate
6 line-item, as defined in section 1 of chapter 29.
