**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act Massachusetts Largest Building Act.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Emergency Preamble-

2 “Whereas, the deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is
3 forthwith to consolidate time and expense involved in the administration of Massachusetts
4 largest building, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the
5 immediate preservation of the public convenience.”

6 Massachusetts Largest Building Act Trust and its appointed commissioner is authorized
7 to provide unused and unlimited treasury notes by the treasury on an ongoing basis for the
8 following facilities and services:

9 Policy to provide unlimited access, coverage and accommodations for the development
10 and maintenance of Massachusetts Largest Building.

- 11 *Massachusetts largest building has the most number of square feet of inhabitable space.
- 12 It provides a landmark architectural development and museum to demonstrate strategies and
- 13 provide educational facility to teach methods of constructing large buildings and its many uses.
