An Act redefining natural gas compressor station.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 164 of the General Laws as appearing in in the 2014  
2 official edition is hereby amended by inserting the following new definition:-

3           “Natural Gas Compressor Station”, a facility designed and constructed to compress  
4 natural gas that originates from an oil and gas well or collection of such wells operating as a  
5 midstream facility for delivery of oil and gas to a transmission pipeline, distribution pipeline,  
6 natural gas processing plant or underground storage field, including one or more natural gas  
7 compressors, associated buildings, pipes valves, tanks and other equipment.

8           SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any natural gas  
9 compressor stations, as defined in SECTION 1 which are operationally and physically similar to  
10 an industrial use shall only be appropriate in industrial zoning districts, as provided in chapter  
11 40E.
