In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to distinctive plates for veterans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. The fifteenth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as
2	appearing in the 2014 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, in line 411, after the
3	word "furnish" the following words:- "without charge".
4 5	SECTION 2. Said fifteenth paragraph of section 2 of chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by striking the third sentence.
6 7	SECTION 3. Said section 2 of chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by inserting the following:-
8	"Notwithstanding any provision of this section, no veteran, who is the owner of a private
9	passenger motor vehicle or a motorcycle, shall be charged an annual fee for a distinctive
10	registration plate."
