An Act protecting veterans’ military medical and service records.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 26 of chapter 31 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking, in lines 22 to 24 inclusive, the words “No  
3 appointing authority shall request military medical records for the purpose of employment other  
4 than that which is required by the administrator” and replacing them with the following words:-

5           Notwithstanding the administrator’s right to require a physician’s certificate in the case of  
6 a disabled veteran aforementioned, no appointing authority shall require, request, or accept an  
7 individual’s military medical records or military service records for the purpose of employment.

8 An appointing authority shall not impose upon an individual as a condition of obtaining or  
9 retaining employment any terms or conditions, compliance with which would require such  
10 individual to present his or her military medical record or military service record.
