An Act requiring medical exams for certain school bus drivers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8A of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 12, the words “licensed physician
3 within a three” and inserting in place thereof the following words:-

4 medical professional listed on the federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration’s National
5 Registry of Certified Medical Examiners within a 6

6 SECTION 2. Section 8A½ of said chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
7 inserting, in line 14, after the word “examination” the following words:-

8 by a medical professional listed on the federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration’s National
9 Registry of Certified Medical Examiners within a 6 month period of the date of his application
