In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to protecting, preserving, and increasing access to family camping.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the department of 2 environmental protection, in consultation with the department of conservation and recreation, 3 shall, within six months of the passage of this act, revise and promulgate rules and regulations to: 4 increase access to camping by encouraging and facilitating the growth of Massachusetts 5 campgrounds, while aiming to simultaneously protect public health, safety and the environment. 6 The department shall revise regulations pertaining to septic flow, volume discharge, greywater, 7 land size, and approved chemical additives to accurately reflect the circumstances associated 8 with seasonal use campgrounds so as to not unnecessarily hinder campground expansion and 9 user access. In revising and promulgating rules and regulations, the department shall consult with 10 interest groups including, but not limited to the Massachusetts Association of Campground 11 Owners and the Massachusetts Camping Association.
