An Act relative to school bus driver licensing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 8A 1/2 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing the 2014
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended in line 16 by inserting after the word "registrar" the
3	following:- "provided, however, that such person is determined to have a clean driving record at
4	the time of application, as outlined in this section".
5	SECTION 2. Said section 8A ¹ / ₂ of said Chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby amended
6	by inserting after the first paragraph the following paragraph:
7	For the purposes of this section, a person shall be determined to have a clean driving
8	record if the person has:
9	(1) no traffic violations in the previous year;
10	(2) no major traffic violations, as defined in 211 CMR 134.10(3)(c), in the previous 5
11	years, and not more than 3 such violations in the applicant's driving history;
12	(3) not more than 5 minor traffic violations, as defined in 211 CMR 134.10(3)(d), in the
13	previous 5 years; and

14 (4) not more than 3 at-fault accidents in the previous 5 years.
