An Act expanding the powers of the director of Fisheries and Wildlife.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 57 of chapter 131 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 official edition,
2	is hereby amended by inserting after the word "director", in line 14, the following sentence:-
3	Notwithstanding, this section shall not prohibit the director, with the approval of the fisheries and
4	wildlife board, to authorize the hunting of deer by bow and arrow on any Sunday, provided that
5	such hunting shall only be permitted, subject to the authorization of the director, on property
6	designated as a wildlife management area, property under wildlife conservation easement, and
7	private property with prior authorization from the owner or tenant.
