In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act establishing a special commission relative to digital textbooks.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

| 1 | A special commission is hereby established to study and report on how to maximize the |

| 2 | use of digital and open textbooks for K-12 and public colleges and universities. The commission |
| 3 | shall consist of 11 members as follows: the Commissioner of Education or his designee; the |
| 4 | Commissioner of Higher Education or his designee; two representatives of Massachusetts-based |
| 5 | textbook companies and a representative of the State I.T. office appointed by the Governor; the |
| 6 | House and Senate chairs of the Education and Higher Education committees; a member of the |
| 7 | House appointed by the House Minority Leader; and a member of the Senate appointed by the |
| 8 | Senate Minority Leader. The commission shall report to the General Court the results of its |
| 9 | study, along with recommendations and draft legislation on or before January 31, 2018. |
