An Act relative to work requirements.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 18 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended in subsection (B) by inserting the following new paragraph:-  
3           (t) require all recipients over the age of 18 to work to remain eligible for cash assistance.  
4 Recipients must work the required hours per week as specified in 106 CMR 203.400(A)(5). This  
5 provision shall not apply to recipients who are attending a secondary school full time,  
6 participating in an education or training activity, as defined in 106 CMR 203.400(A)(2)(i), or  
7 exempt from the work requirements under 106 CMR 203.400(A)(1)(a) through (c), inclusive.  
8 The recipient must meet this requirement within 60 days of receiving cash assistance.
