In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to testimony in criminal proceedings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 20 of chapter 233 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the clause Fourth and inserting in place
- 3 thereof the following clause:-
- Fourth, Except in a proceeding before an inquest, grand jury, trial of an indictment or
- 5 complaint or any other criminal, delinquency or youthful offender proceeding where the victim
- 6 in the proceeding is not a family member and does not reside in the family household, neither the
- 7 parent nor minor child shall testify against the other; provided, however, that for the purpose of
- 8 this clause, "parent" shall mean the biological or adoptive parent, stepparent, foster parent, legal
- 9 guardian or any other person who has the right to act in loco parentis for the child; and provided,
- 10 further, that in cases where the victim is a family member and resides in the family household,

- 11 the parent shall not testify as to any communication with the child that was for the purpose of
- seeking advice regarding the child's legal rights.
