An Act to Amend G.L. c. 221 § 27A: Obsolete or useless papers; disposition, destruction or storage.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 27A of chapter 221 of the General Laws, as amended by section  
2 124 of chapter 46 of the acts of 2015, is hereby further amended in paragraph (1) by adding at  
3 the end there of the following:- “The Supreme Judicial Court may by rule or order make  
4 exceptions to this ten year retention requirement for papers filed in or relating to matters  
5 involving alleged violations of laws, rules or regulations regarding motor vehicle civil  
6 infractions, motor vehicle parking, littering, bicycles, pedestrians, municipal dog control, or non-  
7 criminal dispositions of municipal ordinance or by-law violations, or other non-criminal  
8 regulatory offenses.”
