Dear Superintendent Hallett:

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (Department) has received your Plan of Correction dated September 11, 2017 in response to Amy Riordan's inspection on June 12 and 13, 2017. After review, the Department finds the plan does not appropriately address all of the violations noted.

Please indicate if:

1. The Quaternary ammonium compound (QAC) temperature is now within compliance in the Smith Food Service Kitchen;
2. The utensils in the C Corridor of Inner Perimeter Security have been covered;
3. The shower temperature is now within compliance in the Modular Building;
4. Food was removed from the freezer with Norovirus kits at the Infirmary in RN Clinic # 1.

In instances where you indicate:

1. Referred to Maintenance; and
2. Referred to Maintenance for replacement

Please provide either a date of correction for the violations or a date the violations will be corrected.

The time frame you've provided to:

1. Clean dusty vents;
2. Remove mops from buckets; and
3. Adjust loose ceiling tiles

In order to satisfy the requirements of the code please provide either a date of correction for the violation or a date the violation will be corrected.

Your Plan of Correction (POC) states that the skylight structure in ATU West is awaiting approval for Capital Funding. While the Department recognizes the complexities of managerial and budgetary constraints, we cannot approve any items that do not identify a reasonable time frame for repair. In addition we ask to be kept apprised of the Capital Funding progress.

Your Plan of Correction indicates you have submitted a waiver from the Department of Corrections (DOC) regarding floor space in cells. Please be advised that the DOC does not have the authority to issue waivers for any provisions of 105 CMR 451.000, therefore we cannot accept a waiver from the DOC as a means of remedy. The Department appreciates the limitations of correctional facilities and the need to accommodate the ever-increasing population; however we remain concerned with the overcrowded conditions.
