2017 Municipal Naloxone Bulk Purchase Trust Fund Annual Report

March, 2018



Legislative Mandate

The following annual report is hereby issued pursuant to Section 2RRRR of Chapter 29 of the Massachusetts General Laws:

Section 2RRRR. (a) There shall be a Municipal Naloxone Bulk Purchase Trust Fund to be administered and expended by the commissioner of public health or a designee for the municipal naloxone bulk purchase program. Municipalities may join the program to purchase naloxone for municipal first responder agencies. The state office of pharmacy services shall assist with the purchasing and distribution of naloxone on behalf of the program. The department of public health shall provide technical assistance to participating municipalities to ensure that municipalities complete all training and registration requirements.

(b) The fund shall consist of: (i) payments made by participating municipalities for the purchase of naloxone; (ii) revenue from appropriations or other monies authorized by the general court and specifically designated to be credited to the fund; and (iii) funds from public or private sources, including, but not limited to, gifts, grants, donations, rebates and settlements received by the commonwealth that are specifically designated to be credited to the fund. Funds received under clauses (ii) or (iii) shall be apportioned in a manner determined by the department and shall be applied to provide price reductions for municipalities purchasing naloxone through the program. Amounts credited to the fund shall not be subject to further appropriation and monies remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the General Fund. The commissioner shall report annually not later than October 1 to the house and senate committees on ways and means on the fund's activity. The report shall include, but not be limited to, revenue received by the fund, revenue and expenditure projections for the forthcoming fiscal year and details of all expenditures from the fund, the municipalities participating in the program, the amount of naloxone purchased by each municipality and the discount procured through bulk purchasing.

Background

In 2015, the Legislature established the Municipal Naloxone Bulk Purchasing (bulk purchasing) program, which allows municipalities to purchase naloxone for municipal first responder agencies at a discounted rate. Naloxone, a medication used to reverse the effects of opioids, including heroin, is used across the Commonwealth by first responders. Municipalities have seen a significant increase in cost and demand since the beginning of the opioid epidemic.

The State Office for Pharmacy Services (SOPS) is the Department of Public Health (DPH) division responsible for managing the bulk purchase program. SOPS receives requests directly from municipalities, purchases the naloxone on their behalf, ships and invoices directly. SOPS also manages the funds received from the cities and towns, reorders and maintains inventory to achieve the best price possible.

Through the FY16 budget, a Trust Fund was established to accept: (i) payments made by participating municipalities for the purchase of Naloxone; (ii) revenue from appropriations or other monies authorized by the general court and specifically designated to be credited to the fund; and (iii) funds from public or private sources, including, but not limited to, gifts, grants, donations, rebates and settlements received by the commonwealth that are specifically designated to be credited to the fund.

Revenue Received by the Fund

During FY17, total payments received from 285 orders was \$238,608.90. This represented 143 municipalities (police & fire), 10 school districts/colleges, 2 county sheriff's departments, MA Trial Court, State Police Crime Lab, Middlesex and Norfolk County DA Office and the Steamship Authority.

Details of all FY17 Expenditures from the Fund

A total of \$392,251.02 was expended from the fund to purchase:

650 doses Naloxone 2mg Syringe

Nasal Atomizers

13,296 doses Narcan 4mg Nasal Spray (6648 boxes of 2)

The Narcan 4mg Nasal Spray was made available and began shipping in November 2016, becoming the preferred product for most agencies due to ease of use and effectiveness

During FY17, the nasal atomizer manufacturer (Teleflex) had a product recall due to the concern of inadequate drug distribution. A recall process was implemented by SOPS to retrieve the affected product, return it to the wholesaler, and re-distribute new product. At the time of the recall in November 2016, the nasal spray was not yet available. New product became available on 1/4/17, at which time SOPS accepted the recalled product and shipped replacement atomizers. The recalled atomizers were returned to wholesaler for credit. Around the same time (mid-November), the Adapt product became available and SOPS was able to provide a discounted price of \$40.00 per box of two. For the most part, first responders changed their purchases from the Naloxone syringe and nasal atomizer to the Narcan Spray.

FY18 Projections

Within the first three months of FY18, the Municipal Bulk Purchasing settlement fund that provided discounted product to first responders had been depleted. New acquisition costs for ALL agencies as of 10/1/2017:

Naloxone 2mg Syringe \$29.28 each (previously \$20.00 each due to settlement offset for first

responders)

Nasal Atomizers \$ 4.32 each

Narcan 4mg Spray \$71.02 per box of 2 (previously \$40.00 per box due to settlement

offset for first responders)

The \$71.02 cost is the Public Interest Contract Price. This price is still considerably less than current prices from distributors which is approximately \$125.00 per box of 2. With this increase, some first responders have reduced their purchasing habits as they navigate their budgets. At the same time, DPH is receiving reports of an increase in the number of doses of naloxone needed to revive someone from an overdose due to fentanyl in the illicit opioid supply, which puts additional pressure on municipal budgets. These competing pressures at the local level make it difficult to project future orders for naloxone through the program. All revenue received from municipalities is be used to bulk purchase naloxone at the lowest cost possible.
