An Act to increase access to nurse-midwifery services.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 47E of Chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016  
2 Official Edition is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:

3 The reimbursement for the services provided shall be in the same amount as the  
4 reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing the service in the area  
5 served. An insurer may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to  
6 comply with this section.

7 SECTION 2. Chapter 176A of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding section  
8 38:

9 Any contract between a subscriber and the corporation under an individual or group  
10 hospital service plan delivered, issued or renewed in the commonwealth shall provide, as  
11 benefits to all individual subscribers and members within the commonwealth and to all group  
12 members having a principal place of employment within the commonwealth for services  
13 rendered by a certified nurse midwife designated as such certified nurse midwife by the board of  
14 registration in nursing pursuant to the provisions of section eighty C of chapter one hundred and  
15 twelve; provided, however, that the following conditions are met: (1) the service rendered is  
16 within the scope of the certified nurse midwife's authorization to practice by the board of  
17 registration in nursing; (2) the policy or contract currently provides benefits for identical  
18 services rendered by a provider of health care licensed by the commonwealth: and (3) the  
19 reimbursement for the services provided shall be in the same amount as the reimbursement paid  
20 under the policy to a licensed physician performing the service in the area served. An insurer  
21 may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to comply with this  
22 section.

23 SECTION 3. Section 4G of Chapter 176B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016  
24 Official Edition is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:

25 The reimbursement for the services provided shall be in the same amount as the  
26 reimbursement paid under the policy to a licensed physician performing the service in the area  
27 served. An insurer may not reduce the reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to  
28 comply with this section.

29 SECTION 4. Section 4 of Chapter 176 G is of the General Laws, as appearing in the  
30 2016 Official Edition is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following subsection:

31           (h) services rendered by a certified nurse midwife pursuant to section eighty C of chapter  
32 one hundred and twelve, subject to the terms of a negotiated agreement between the health  
33 maintenance organization and the provider of health care services. The reimbursement for the  
34 services provided shall be in the same amount as the reimbursement paid under the policy to a  
35 licensed physician performing the service in the area served. An insurer may not reduce the  
36 reimbursement paid to a licensed physician in order to comply with this section.
