HOUSE No. 145

By Mr. Mark of Peru, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 145) of Paul W. Mark and others relative to establishing within the Department of Transitional Assistance an agricultural healthy incentives program operated in partnership with the Department of Agricultural Resources and the Department of Public Health. Children, Families and Persons with Disabilities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to an agricultural healthy incentives program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 128 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 section 2E the following section:-
- 3 Section 2F. (a) There shall be within the Department of Transitional Assistance a
- 4 healthy incentives program operated in partnership with the Department of Agricultural
- 5 Resources and the Department of Public Health. The program shall provide that for every dollar
- 6 of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits, established pursuant to the Food and
- 7 Nutrition Act of 2008, 7 U.S.C. section 2011 hereinafter referred to as SNAP, redeemed for fruit
- 8 and vegetable purchases, either fresh, canned, dried or frozen, by a SNAP recipient, the recipient
- 9 shall receive a matching benefit reimbursed on the recipient's EBT card of one dollar, within
- limits to be established by the department.

(b) There shall be established and set up on the books of the
commonwealth a separate fund, to be jointly administered by the commissioners of the
department of agricultural resources and the department of transitional assistance, which shall be
known as the Massachusetts Healthy Incentives Fund. The Fund shall consist of all revenues
from public and private sources as appropriations, gifts, grants and donations and from the
federal government as reimbursements, grants-in-aid or other receipts to further the purposes of
the Fund in accordance with this section.

- (c) The Department of Transitional Assistance and its partners shall apply for any available federal programs such as Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive Grants administered by the United States Department of Agriculture to provide matching benefits to be deposited in the Fund.
- SECTION 2. The Department of Transitional Assistance shall promulgate rules and regulations to implement the program set forth in section 1.
