An Act creating a youth wage.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	Section 1 of chapter 151 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding at the end of
2	the first paragraph the following:
3	"This section shall not apply to workers under 18 years of age who work less than 20 per

4 week. For said workers under the age of 18 who work less than 20 hours per week the federal

5 minimum wage pursuant to 29 U.S.C. § 206 shall apply."
