*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. The General Court hereby finds and declares that the use of the so-called  
2   Dover amendment by nonprofit institutions to avoid wetland or natural resource area protections  
3   may be harmful to the public health and environment.

4           SECTION 2. Section 3 of chapter 40A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016  
5   Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 49, the words “restrict the” and  
6   inserting in place thereof the following words:- restrict, other than through wetlands or natural  
7   resource area protections, the.
