## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to the definition of podiatry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 112 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by striking out section 13, as so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the
- 3 following section:-
- Section 13. (a) As used in this chapter, "podiatry" shall mean the diagnosis and treatment,
- 5 by medical, mechanical, electrical or surgical means, of ailments of the human foot and lower
- 6 leg.
- 7 (b) As used in sections 12B, 12G and 80B, "physician" shall include a podiatrist
- 8 registered under section 16.
- 9 (c) Sections 13 to 18, inclusive, shall not apply to surgeons of the United States army,
- 10 United States navy or of the United States Public Health Service or to physicians registered in
- 11 the commonwealth.
