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The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court  
(2019-2020)  
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An Act relative to the prescription monitoring program.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts  
2 Prescription Monitoring Programs (MassPat 2015) shall require any person or persons  
3 prescribing any Schedule 2 through Schedule 5 drug to submit a daily report of the issuance of  
4 the said prescriptions by any and all medical practioners for use by doctors, pharmacies, walk-in  
5 clinics, practitioners, and patients to track any Schedule 2 to Schedule 5 drug prescribed to an  
6 individual from the point of prescription to consumption as a mechanism for addressing the  
7 loophole in the Commonwealth's existing prescription monitoring system (M.G.L.c94C, The  
8 Controlled Substances Act). The mechanism seeks to set standards that expand the  
9 Commonwealth's prescription monitoring system to track the over-prescription of drugs by  
10 medical practitioners and to track such prescriptions to keep patients safe.
