In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)

An Act exempting veterans’ organizations from state and local meals tax.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 64H of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting after the figure “fifteen”, in line 434, the following words:- ; and
3 meals served by a veterans’ organization; provided, that the meals are: (i) furnished without
4 charge, (ii) served at a potluck event, as defined in section 328A of section 94; (iii) served at
5 price equal to the cost of the component food; or (iv) served by a veterans’ organization for
6 which the sale of meals accounts for less than 20 per cent of the veterans’ organization annual
7 revenue.
