By Mr. Cahill of Lynn, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2678) of Daniel Cahill and others relative to establishing a special commission (including members of the General Court) to study the participation of minority business enterprises and women business enterprises in public construction projects. State Administration and Regulatory Oversight.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act creating a special commission to study the participation of minority business enterprises and women business enterprises in public construction projects.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the
2 contrary, there shall be established a special commission to investigate, study, and make
3 legislative recommendations on the adequacy and efficiency of laws and regulations governing
4 the participation of minority business enterprises and women business enterprises on public
5 construction projects. The commission shall consist of 20 members, 1 of whom shall be
6 appointed by the governor who shall serve as the co-chairman of the commission; 1 of whom
7 shall be appointed by the attorney general, 3 of whom shall be members of the senate, 2 of whom
8 shall be appointed by the president of the senate, of which 1 shall serve as co-chairman of the
9 commission and 1 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate; 3 of whom
10 shall be members of the house of representatives, 2 of whom shall be appointed by the speaker of
11 the house, of which 1 shall serve as co-chairman of the commission and 1 of whom shall be

12 appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives; the commissioner of the
13 department of capital asset management and maintenance; the inspector general; the chairperson
14 or his designee of the Massachusetts Municipal Association; the president or his designee of the
15 Massachusetts Building Trades Council; the president or his designee of the Associated General
16 Contractors of Massachusetts; the president or his designee of the Building Trades Employers
17 Association; the president or his designee of Associated Subcontractors of Massachusetts; the
18 president or his designee of Construction Industries of Massachusetts; the president or his
19 designee of the Massachusetts AFL-CIO; a representative of the Massachusetts Minority
20 Contractors Association, a representative of the National Association of Women and
21 Construction, and a representative of The Policy Group on Tradeswomen's issues. The
22 commission shall file a report on the results of its study, together with its recommendations, if
23 any, and any legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, with the clerks of
24 the house of representatives and the senate not later than December 31, 2020.
