Resolve providing for the erection in the house chamber of a memorial containing the text of the address which Reverend Doctor Martin Luther King Jr. delivered to a joint convention of the 2 branches of the General Court on April 22, 1965.

1 **Resolved**, that the superintendent of the bureau of the state house shall, subject to the
2 approval of the art commission as to size and content, install and maintain a plaque in a suitable
3 space in the chamber of the house of representatives a memorial of bronze or other appropriate
4 material containing a portion of the address which Martin Luther King Jr. delivered to a joint
5 convention of the two branches of the general court on April twenty-second, nineteen hundred
6 and sixty-five. In determining the form of such memorial, said commission shall consult with the
7 house committee on rules, the Massachusetts Black and Latino Legislative Caucus, and shall
8 cause said memorial to be officially installed in the chamber of the house of representatives.
