**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court  
(2019-2020)**

An Act requiring legislative approval of natural gas compressor stations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1: The general court shall have the power to oversee and approve the sighting  
2 and licensing of any natural gas compressor stations within the Commonwealth of  
3 Massachusetts.

4 SECTION 2: The Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Public  
5 Utilities, and any other agency of the Commonwealth responsible for issuing permits for the  
6 construction of a natural gas compressor station shall not do so unless these permits are approved  
7 and enacted by a two thirds vote, taken by the yeas and nays, of each branch of the general court.  
8 The legislation to approve the permits and construction of a natural gas compressor station must  
9 be sponsored and approved by a member(s) of the general court.

10 SECTION 3: Any permits issued prior to the enactment of this legislation shall be  
11 deemed invalid, and must be submitted before the legislature for approval by a two thirds vote,  
12 taken by the yeas and nays, of each branch of the general court.
