An Act relative to keeping multiple copies of handicapped parking placards.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The ninth paragraph of Section 2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 2014 official edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 302-305, the
3 following words-

4 "The registrar may also furnish a special parking identification placard bearing the
5 designation 'International Symbol of Access' to any person who meets the eligibility
6 requirements for handicapped plates prescribed herein."

7 and inserting in place thereof the following words-

8 "The registrar may also furnish one (1) copy of a special parking identification placard
9 bearing the designation 'International Symbol of Access' per motor vehicle registered to any
10 person who meets the eligibility requirements for handicapped plates prescribed herein or to any
11 household member of a person so eligible, provided that the household member in possession of
12 a placard is transporting the eligible person while the placard is in use."
