Naughton, Jr. (by vote of the town) that the town of Lancaster be authorized to continue the employment of Maurice Bateman, a firefighter/EMT of the fire department of said town. Public Service. An Act relative to the fire department of the town of Lancaster.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,
2 Firefighter/EMT Maurice Bateman of the fire department of the town of Lancaster, may continue
3 to serve in that position until the date of his retirement or until the date he is relieved of his duties
4 by the Fire Chief, whichever occurs first; provided, however, that he is mentally and physically
5 capable of performing the duties of his office. The board of selectmen of the town of Lancaster,
6 at its own expense, may require that Maurice Bateman be examined by an impartial physician
7 designated by the board to determine his mental and physical capability. No further deductions
8 shall be made from the regular compensation of Maurice Bateman under chapter 32 of the
9 General Laws for any service subsequent to (65th Birth date), and upon retirement, he shall
10 receive a superannuation retirement allowance equal to that which he would have been entitled
11 had he retired on (65th Birthday).

12 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
