An Act relative to election procedures in the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1. Section 54 of chapter 452 of the acts of 1948 as most recently amended by  
2   section 2.54 of chapter 376 of the acts of 1951, is hereby amended by adding the following:-  
3   Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, any individual duly qualified to be a candidate for an  
4   elective office shall not be a candidate for nomination for two such elective offices at the same  
5   municipal election.

6           Section 2. The provisions of this act shall take effect upon its passage.

7           Section 3. If any of the above sections are determined to not be constitutional under the  
8   law, the remainder of the provisions shall remain valid.
