An Act authorizing the town of Maynard to grant additional alcoholic beverages licenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding Section 17 of Chapter 138 of the Massachusetts General  
2 Laws, the licensing authority of the Town of Maynard may grant one (1) additional license, in  
3 addition to the three (3) which they currently have, for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be  
4 drunk off premise under Section 15 of said Chapter 138. The license shall be subject to all of  
5 said Chapter 138, except section 17.

6           SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Sections 12 and 77 of Chapter 138 of the Massachusetts  
7 General Laws, the licensing authority of the Town of Maynard may restrict the licenses issue  
8 pursuant to this Act to holders of common victualler licenses.

9           SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
