**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court  
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to the use of temporary door locking devices in public schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

2 Section 98. (a) As used in this section, “temporary door locking device” shall mean a  
3 lock, tool or other device that an average person is capable of installing and removing in 60  
4 seconds or less that is designed for the purpose of locking a door upon installation.

5 (b) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the school committee of  
6 any city, town or regional school district or the board of trustees of a charter school may, by vote  
7 of said school committee or board, allow temporary door locking devices to be maintained and  
8 utilized in classrooms and school buildings under the jurisdiction of that school district or board.
