## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act providing benefits for permanent functional loss and disfigurement under the Worker's Compensation Act.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	SECTION 1. Section 36 of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 78, in subsection (k), the words
3	"fifteen thousand dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- 30 times the
4	average weekly wage in the commonwealth as determined pursuant to subsection (a) of section
5	29 of chapter 151A and by striking out in lines 79-81 the words "No amount shall be payable
6	under this section for disfigurement that is purely scar-based, unless such disfigurement is on the
7	face, neck or hands."
