An Act relative to employment protections for medical marijuana patients.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1                   SECTION 1. Subsection (b) of Section 2 of Chapter 94I of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by inserting after the word “property.” in line 28, the following:-

3                   (5) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, nothing in this  
4 chapter shall be construed to allow a person to discharge or cause to be discharged or to  
5 otherwise discipline or in any manner discriminate against any employee or candidate for  
6 employment for the reason that said employee or candidate for employment is a user of medical  
7 marijuana outside of the workplace, pursuant to protections against discrimination on the basis of  
8 disability in Chapter 151B of the General Laws.
