In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act to provide short-term relief for families in deep poverty.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2020 in order to provide prompt relief to families, elders and persons with disabilities struggling to meet unanticipated expenditures and loss of income due to the COVID-19 pandemic, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. To provide for supplementing certain items in the general appropriation act
- 2 and other appropriation acts for fiscal year 2020, the sums set forth in section 2 are hereby
- 3 appropriated from the General Fund for the several purposes and subject to the conditions
- 4 specified in this act and subject to the laws regulating the disbursement of public funds for the
- 5 fiscal year ending June 30, 2020. These sums shall be in addition to any amounts previously
- 6 appropriated and made available for the purposes of those items. These sums shall be made
- 7 available until June 30, 2020.
