## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act providing certain state employees sick leave for COVID-19 related absences.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any employee of the
- 2 commonwealth who is absent from work due to COVID-19 infection, quarantine or isolation as
- 3 directed by a physician or authorized public health authority and does not have sufficient earned
- 4 sick leave time for the absence, shall be granted sufficient sick leave time to ensure any absence
- 5 from work due to COVID-19 infection, quarantine or isolation is paid.
- This act will be in effect until 60 days after the state of emergency is lifted.
