**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court  
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to state employees performing core functions.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any employee  
2 of the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions who was required to work during the  
3 Massachusetts state emergency related to COVID 19 declared on March 11, and required to  
4 report to a work location outside of their home, shall be compensated retroactively at a rate of  
5 one and a half times their regular rate of pay for every day that they were required to report to  
6 work for the duration of the state emergency, or in lieu of compensation an employee may, at  
7 their discretion, receive one half day of compensatory leave for each day, or portion thereof  
8 worked during the duration of the state emergency.

9           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
