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By Ms. Domb of Amherst, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Mindy Domb and others for legislation to suspend payment and collection of student loan payments provided for post-secondary education or vocational training during the COVID-19 emergency declaration and to designate certain outstanding bonds used to fund said loans as general obligation bonds. **In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act suspending student loan debt due to the COVID-19 emergency.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish forthwith debt relief for student loans issued by the commonwealth, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Every public agency or authority of the commonwealth, including, but not
2 limited to, the Massachusetts Educational Financing Authority shall, during the period of the
3 declaration of the governor of a state of emergency to respond to COVID-19 under executive
4 order 519 and until 360 days after the expiration of such emergency, suspend payment and
5 collection of student loan payments provided for post-secondary education or vocational training.
6 Interest on such payments will not accrue during this time, nor will any additional fees as a result
7 of the suspension.

8 For the purposes of this act, the term “student loan” shall mean a loan to a borrower to
9 finance or refinance a student's attendance at an institution for higher education or vocational
10 school.

11 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, a bond or note
12 issued pursuant to chapter 12 of the General Laws or any other general or special law whose
13 proceeds were used to provide student loans, shall, on the effective date of this act, become a
14 general obligation of the commonwealth and subject to the provisions of this act. The
15 commonwealth shall be obligated to pay the principal and interest of any such bond or note
16 under the full faith and credit and taxing power of the commonwealth.
