By Representative McKenna of Webster and Senator Fattman, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4955) of Joseph D. McKenna and Ryan C. Fattman (by vote of the town) that the town of Webster be authorized to exempt certain positions in the police department of said town from the civil service law. Public Service. ### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act exempting certain positions of the police department of the town of Webster from the civil service law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, all positions in the
- 2 police department of the Town of Webster shall be exempt from Chapter 31 of the Massachusetts
- 3 General Laws.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall not impair the civil service status of a person holding a position
- 5 described in section 1 on the effective date of this act.
- 6 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
