An Act pertaining to liquor licenses in the town of Brookline.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (b)(1) of section 1 of chapter 268 of the acts of 2018 is hereby
2 amended by striking out the word “three”, and inserting in place thereof the following word:-
3 four.

4 SECTION 2. Subsection (b)(2) of said section 1 of said chapter 268 of the acts of 2018 is
5 hereby amended by striking out the word “five”, and inserting in place thereof the following
6 word:- six.

7 SECTION 3. Subsection (b)(4) of said section 1 of said chapter 268 of the acts of 2018 is
8 hereby amended by striking out the word “three”, and inserting in place thereof the following
9 word:- one.

10 SECTION 4. Subsection (f) of said section 1 of chapter 268 of the acts of 2018 is hereby
11 amended by striking out the number “2”, and inserting in place thereof the following number:- 4.
