The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act requiring carbon monoxide alarms in schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 26F¹/₂ of Chapter 148 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the

2 following:

3 (g) Every building or structure, including those owned by the Commonwealth, 4 occupied in whole or in part as a school subject to the authority of the Department of Elementary 5 and Secondary Education, that: (1) contains fossil-fuel burning equipment including, but not 6 limited to, a furnace, boiler, water heater, fireplace or any other apparatus, appliance or device 7 that burns fossil fuel; or (2) incorporates enclosed parking within its structure shall be equipped 8 by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education with working, approved carbon 9 monoxide alarms in conformance with the requirements of the board of fire prevention 10 regulations.
