**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to absentee ballots.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 54 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 89 the
2 following section:-

3 Section 89A.

4 Records identifying any voter who has applied to vote by absentee ballot shall be kept
5 confidential and shall not be considered a public record under clause Twenty-sixth of section 7
6 of chapter 4 until the ballot has been returned; provided, however, that election officials may use
7 these records in the proper discharge of their duties.
