In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to permanent funding for early voting.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 25B of chapter 54 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (q) the following subsection:-
3	(r) the commonwealth shall pay to each city and town an amount sufficient to defray the
4	mandated costs imposed on the city or town under the provisions of this section, including
5	additional personnel hired for staffing to conduct early voting, hourly municipal staff working
6	outside their normal business hours to staff the mandated early voting polling location, overtime
7	for hourly municipal staff working beyond regular hours to setup or take down early voting
8	polling locations, overtime for hourly municipal staff working beyond regular hours to input data
9	into the secretary of state's Voter Registration Information System, the cost of supplies needed to
10	implement early voting. In every year not later than September 15th, the state auditor shall
11	determine and deliver to the state secretary a statement of the incremental costs attributed to this
12	section and estimated to be incurred by each city and town in the next fiscal year. The state

13 secretary shall include in his budget recommendations for such fiscal year a request for an 14 appropriation in an amount equal to such estimated costs, and shall distribute to each city or 15 town its share of any such appropriated funds not more than 30 days prior to the date upon which 16 said costs shall be incurred by the city or town. Funds so distributed to each city or town shall be 17 deposited in the general fund of the city or town and shall be expended without further 18 appropriation by the city or town to meet the costs incurred by it under the provisions of this 19 section.
