An Act relative to coyote bait trapping.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 131 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition is hereby  
2 amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new section:-

3 Section 119. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no person,  
4 except as provided in sections four, thirty-seven, and thirty-eight, shall erect, set, use, locate,  
5 repair, tend, bait or maintain any trap, net or snare for the purpose of taking or killing any bird or  
6 mammal within three hundred feet from a public roadway, pathway or trail.

7 Any trap, net or snare may not be erected, used, tended, baited or in any other way  
8 maintained for a period exceeding seven consecutive days, except as provided in said sections  
9 four, thirty-seven, and thirty-eight.
