An Act relative to constitutional rights.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 140 shall be amended by inserting the following section:-
- 2 Section 120A. No county, municipality, township or other community entity within the
- 3 Commonwealth of Massachusetts may enact, pass or enforce any law, ordinance or regulation
- 4 concerning the lawful ownership, use, possession, transfer, purchase, receipt or transportation of
- 5 weapons, antique weapons, ammunition or ammunition components.
- The right to keep and bear arms is an individual civil right and shall be presumed to exist
- 7 in all matters regarding the ownership, use, possession, transfer, purchase, receipt or
- 8 transportation of weapons, antique weapons, ammunition or ammunition components unless
- 9 expressly prohibited by the general laws of this Commonwealth.
