In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to roadway safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 11 of chapter 89 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- A person using a non-motorized vehicle, which shall mean a non-motorized scooter,
- 4 bicycle, and small-wheeled transport such as roller blades, roller skates or a skateboard, who is
- 5 crossing the roadway in a marked crosswalk where traffic control signals are not in place or not
- 6 in operation, shall be considered a pedestrian for purposes of this section.
